INSTRUCTIONS FOR A CUSTOMER TO HAVE POWER CONNECTED RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL

- A. In order to receive power for a SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCE, DUPLEX, or APARTMENT after your power has been disconnected for more than 12 months you must follow these instructions.
- B. In order to receive power for your COMMERCIAL PROPERTY or anytime there is a change of occupancy or use, you follow these instructions.
- C. In order to receive power for a NEW BUSINESS, a Business Tax Receipt safety inspection must be performed. Any safety violations must be corrected by a licensed electrical contractor with a safety permit. This work must pass inspection.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BE FOLLOWED

1. The OWNER/TENANT of the property must hire a licensed electrical contractor to pull a permit for a safety inspection and any electrical work that may be required. After all necessary work is completed by the contractor; he must submit a notarized letter stating the premises are in safe condition for power.
2. Contractor must call for an inspection, so the City Electrical Inspector can complete his inspection for approval for power to be connected or reconnected.
3. Upon approval by the City Inspector, the Electrical Utilities Department (Customer Service) will be notified by FAX of the APPROVAL by the DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT.
4. After steps 1 thru 3 have been completed the customer shall go to the Utilities Department (Customer Service) to submit, all required paperwork and fees.

THIS IS ONLY A GENERAL GUIDELINE FOR A CUSTOMER TO OBTAIN POWER; THE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REVIEW APPLICATIONS ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS.
